One of the most exciting parts of the school year for upperclassmen is Prom. This year it was held at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, which everyone was ecstatic about. This years Prom was planned by Bobby Zajec, Izzy Goodwin, Abby Friedman, Madison Shaffer, Danielle Silver and Suchi Patel with the help of the beloved French teacher, Madame Burich. Students ate and then danced for hours and hours on end, impatiently awaiting the Prom King and Queen announcement. Finally the DJ cut the music and the junior class announced Alex Scampitila and Elizabeth Reisman as King and Queen.

This year spring sports did amazing, specifically baseball. Coaches DJ Rappaselli, Josh Hayes, and Jim Nally took pride as their team finished the season with an overall record of 20-8. The team was named Western Reserve Conference Champions with a record of 12-2 in Conference play. Coach Rapposelli was named WRC Coach of the Year. Anthony DiTomas and Sebastian Alexander were named to the All Ohio 2nd Team. Anthony and Sebastian were also named to the Northeast Ohio Baseball Coaches Association 1st Team. Cole Zak was named to the Northeast Ohio Baseball Coaches Association 2nd Team and Matt Razzante and Alex Scampitilla earned WRC Honorable Mention. Anthony DiTomas, Sebastian Alexander, Cole Zak, Gannon Rose, Joey Suchy, and Sam Coffin all earned WRC All Conference. This was an extremely impressive year for the Wildcats, and it is not expected to stop in 2020 because there will be nine returning varsity players in the spring.

The arts programs at Mayfield had a very successful year as well. Most worthy of mention was the Spring Musical: Shrek the Musical. The cast had chemistry that you could see from the last row of the auditorium. The leads consisted of **Nate Mulbach**, senior, **Briana Mosley**, junior, **Daniel Blum**, freshman, and **Hayden Palmer**, senior. Mayfield's own **Sydney Who** won a Dazzle Award for playing Dragon in the musical.

This years senior class was outstanding. Principal Jeff Legan, '94 announced the following during his graduation speech: To be a National Merit Finalist, students have to score in the top one percent of all students who competed nationally in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. Students who score in the top five present are distinguished as Nationally Commended Scholars. This class had four students earn this honor. They were Jenna Bailey, Adam Gagliardo, Zachary Kallmeyer and Ricky Wu. Zack also earned something that only .195% of over 2 million high school students accomplish across the country ...he scored a perfect 36 on his ACT.

Mayfield High School's AP Calculus Team, comprised of Adam Gagliardo, Zachary Taylor, Elizabeth Shneyderman, Kevin Ng, and Ridha Anjum finished in 1st Place in the state of Ohio and ranked 18th in the nation. Ricky Wu had perfect attendance in his senior year. In fact, Ricky missed only one day of school in his career ...one day in the 3rd grade!

For service to our country, the following students have enlisted in the military: Jezrael Mitchell enlisted in the Navy, Cameron Meeker will be enlisting in the National Guard, Priscilla Richardson is currently serving in the Army Reserves, and Alexis Krejci has enlisted in the Air Force. Ridha Anjum and Owen Kabelitz both received their United States Citizenship this year. And finally, Parth Patel has done something that no other student has ever done in Mayfield's history. 

Judy Delfs - Judy began working for Mayfield's Central Office in 1967 directly after graduating from Mayfield High School. She dedicated 35 years of employment to the district. Judy served as Secretary to the Business Manager initially (1967) and then was also the Benefits Clerk for one year, the Payroll Clerk for one year and Assistant Treasurer for the duration of her time. Post retirement, Judy got involved with the Mayfield Alumni Association where she has been an active Board member since 1994-95. How have those 26 years gone by so quickly? Judy also was recognized as the 2011 Mayfield School District Citizen of the Year. You can currently find Judy at almost every home sporting event at Mayfield High School selling and collecting tickets.

Anna Garris Farinacci - Anna began working as the principal's secretary at Forest Park Junior High School, a new junior high in Euclid, while taking college classes at night. After completing her college work at Kent State with degrees in Elementary Education and English, she taught sixth grade at Memorial Elementary School in Euclid. Seeking an experience with older students, she then taught English in Beachwood at their new "open space" Middle School. She concurrently received her Master's Degree in Guidance and Counseling. Anna was hired at Mayfield as a 9-10 grade counselor in 1971. She found her home. Her career expanded after she was appointed as Guidance Department Chairperson and moved to the 11-12 building. Her specific student assignment was college prep students but the Guidance Department as a whole, was responsible for course selection, college testing, Advanced Placement Testing, coordinating College Night, Financial Aid and Scholarship information and Post Secondary Options. Communicating with parents and teachers, the counselors worked to provide the best information for each student so they would have a successful high school experience. Anna was recognized for her 26 years of service to the students and citizens of Mayfield when she retired in 1997. Anna continued her service to the Mayfield School System when she married Wayne Farinacci in 2003 and became an honorary member of the Alumni Association!

Wayne Farinacci - Wayne began his career as a Special Education teacher. He spent the last 19 years as the Associate Principal for Curriculum and Instruction. Under his leadership, the following improvements were instituted: developed the Master Schedule for students and teachers, expanded the Advanced Placement Program offerings from three courses to 17, maintained responsibility for Dept. Chair Meetings, Educational Options, Post-Secondary Enrollment Options, Ohio Proficiency Testing, North Central Accreditation and Standards, and established the Connections Program, an integrated interdisciplinary curriculum at the 8th, 9th, and 10th grade levels. His greatest accomplishment is establishing the Mayfield Alumni Association and serving as President for the past 39 years. The Alumni Pavilion and Alumni Museum are two significant outcomes the Association has produced. The Association's scholarship awards have increased steadily each year as evidenced by awarding \$28,500 to 37 seniors in 2019. Wayne retired from MHS in 1998 and will continue to lead the Alumni Association until he can't! Wavne was inducted into the Alumni Hall of Fame in 1999 and was the school district's Citizen of the Year in 2013.

Tony Ware - Tony, better known as "T. Ware", was an Industrial Arts Technology Teacher at Mayfield From 1986 to 2014. He became the Department Chairman of the Industrial Arts Department in 2002 and served in that position until his retirement. He coached varsity football at MHS for 12 years and was on the staff of the 1998 Wildcat conference champions and final four in the state. He was the head varsity girls basketball coach at MHS for 28 years, compiling a total of 350 varsity wins. During his coaching tenure, his teams earned four conference championships, five district final appearances, and a 2008 sweet sixteen appearance. T. Ware was a strong advocate for girls athletics during his tenure here at Mayfield. He recently returned to the Mayfield basketball court as the freshman girls coach, continuing his advocacy for girls athletics. He has enjoyed and cherished the many relationships that have developed throughout his careen in the classroom and on the athletic field at Mayfield. T. Ware would like to thank everyone involved int his honor bestowed on him. Finally, he would like to wish all the Wildcat athletic teams much success this year!

Tribute to Albert Jenkins, '40

The following comments were submitted in the Guest Book of Albert Jenkins by President Wayne Farinacci when he heard of Albert's passing in Houston, Texas.

The Mayfield Alumni Association was honored to have **Albert Jenkins** as a long-standing member. Albert was in the **Class of 1940**. He once shared with me how much he owed his life and career to **Harvey Scheetz**, who was a teacher, coach and then principal of Mayfield High School.

One day Mr. Scheetz stopped Albert in the hall to ask him where he was going to college. Albert told Mr. Scheetz that his family didn't have the money to send him to college. Mr. Scheetz would have none of that. Mr. Scheetz then told Albert to wear some nice clothes to school the following Monday because they were going for a ride. Harvey proceeded to take Albert to Kenyon College on Monday. Mr. Scheetz was all too aware of Albert's abundant potential and didn't want to see it wasted. Mr. Scheetz handled that obstacle for Albert, and the rest is history.

When the Mayfield Alumni Association inducted Mr. Scheetz into our **Staff Hall of Fame in 2007**, it seemed to bring Albert back to his roots. It was then that Albert started the **Harvey Scheetz Memorial Scholarship** to honor the man who helped him become successful. Albert's contributions to this scholarship fund were exceptional over the years. Each May at Mayfield's Honors Day Program, three qualified seniors receive the Harvey Scheetz Memorial Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 each. As a result, the spirit of Harvey Scheetz will live for many years to come at Mayfield High School.


