The Mayfield Track & Field team had an amazing season this year. Nick Biega, Luis De La Rosa, Ty Jackson, and Jake Watson all headed to the Ohio High School Athletic Association Track & Field Finals, after a winning competition at the Division I State Track Meet. Mayfield has had 10 straight years with a representative in this meet. Nick Biega, a senior this year, has had a very successful career. This year alone he was state runner-up and a Western Reserve Conference Champion, holding a new meet record for the WRC Boys 100 Meter Dash. Other WRC Champions include; Anthony Howard, Luis De La Rosa, Aidan Arth, and Nick Biega for the Boys 4x100 Meter Relay, Makena Bremec, Kamila Fekete, Sophia Palmisano, and Mai Ly Marella for Girls 4x800 Meter Relay; Sharnse Worthams for the Girls 300 Meter Hurdles; Ryanne Abernathy for the Girls 100 Meter Dash; and **Ty Jackson** for the Boys 110 Meter Hurdles.

The Boys Baseball Team had a strong season as well, earning the title of sectional champions this 2023 season. They then unfortunately lost the District Semifinals to Hudson, 7-1. Mayfield congratulates pitcher/shortstop **Austin Ziance** with Northeast Ohio Baseball Coaches Association Division I Honorable Mention.

Mayfield's spring musical this year was Ragtime, a show about social and racial conflicts that celebrates human connections despite indifferences. It featured a beautiful soundtrack full of harmonies sung by the student cast and melodies played by Mayfield Band students. The roles of Mother and Father were played by Juniors Lauren Peugeot and Michael Wellendorf, Coalhouse Walker was played by Junior Savon Harris, and Sarah by Senior Paris Bunch. This play was then taken downtown to the Dazzle Awards, winning Best Musical, Savon Harris winning best actor, Graham Wilde, winning best supporting actor for the role of Younger Brother, and Cidney Little, winning Spirit of the Dazzle Awards. Other honorees in-

cluded **Paris Bunch**, nominated for Best Actress. **Elizabeth Axelrod**, who played Evelyn Nesbit, was nominated for Best Supporting Actress.

Prom gave the Juniors and Seniors a celebration of their year. Held at La Vera Party center, the Junior Student Council decorated the space in elegant detail, complete with masks provided for all of the students to go along with their theme of 'Masquerade Ball.' The After Prom Committee gave the students 'A Night to Remember,' in perfect conjunction with their theme. Held at Fun 'n' Stuff, there were many activities provided including go karts, laser tag, mini-golf, a game room, and most importantly, a Swenson's food truck. This night ensured many memories for Mayfield's upperclassmen.

On June 3rd, the 123rd commencement of Mayfield High School welcomed our 2023 graduates as Mayfield Alumni. The ceremony was held at the Connor Palace in Cleveland's beautiful Playhouse Square and featured heartfelt speeches from Valedictorian Pranav Sompalle, Salutatorian Mohammed Zoraiz, Student Council President Hailey Inmon, and Senior Class President Jack Pickerill. The opening remarks were delivered warmly by superintendent Dr. Michael Barnes. To lighten the mood with her proudest regards was the school board's president Sue Groszek, where she compared our success to the Roaring 20's. Frank Cikach - In high school Frank was part of the Maple Heights outstanding wrestling dynasty. In 1979, Frank began his career as a teacher and head wrestling coach at Mayfield. Frank had a winning won/loss record in all of his years as head coach. He also had several state champions or state runners-up, as well as many more state placers and qualifiers. As a team, Mayfield was state runner-up in 2002, making the 2002 team the only Mayfield athletic team in modern history to reach this status.

In the early 2000's, Frank continued to coach wrestling but also transitioned from teacher to Department Head of the newly formed Mayfield IT Department. Through Frank's leadership, the foundation was laid for what Mayfield Technology has become today. Under Frank's leadership and philosophy of "move slow to move fast", the school district did not have to keep pulling things back for delays and corrections. This practice put Mayfield ahead of many other school districts. **John Duplay**, current Department Head of IT, worked with Frank before taking over the department.

The Mayfield Family owes a debt of gratitude to Frank Cikach for his many years of leadership in helping to keep Mayfield a top tier school district.

Al Hess, '72

Tim Donoughe - Mr. Donoughe was my sophomore year Algebra teacher and was a member of the Math Department staff for 30 years. During his tenure, Mr. Donoughe embodied the Mayfield spirit and was beloved by his students. His charismatic teaching style allowed him to connect with every student in the class, whether math was a

strength of theirs or not. He commanded the classroom while making learning fun. He definitely had the respect of his students and the rest of the Mayfield staff and administration.

I'm certain there are plenty of other former students who would echo my endorsement of Mr. Donoughe. As the AP Calculus teacher, some of Mayfield's brightest minds learned from him. I remember attending the Top 40 Dinner and Awards Program, where the top graduating seniors are honored and get to recognize a teacher from elementary school, middle school or high school. Mr. Donoughe was easily the most recognized educator that night, and for good reason. He is simply a great teacher and role model.

I have also had the good fortune to know Mr. Donohue outside the classroom, as he is a close family friend. The same characteristics that make him a tremendous teacher carry over to his personal life as he is a wonderful human being. He is worthy of this honor and would be a great addition to the Mayfield Alumni's Staff Hall of Fame.

Millicent Sinden - Miss Sinden taught mathematics and biology at MHS for many years. She taught my class of first year algebra in the mid 1950s. She was able to communicate the language of algebraic equations in a way that we understood and were able to learn. This established a firm foundation for further studies in geometry, advanced algebra, ad trigonometry.

Although Miss Sinden did not teach my biology class she knew of my interest in biology. She encouraged me and provided supplemental readings in biology for me. Miss Sinden was one of the earliest supporters of my interest in medicine. I do not know when Miss Sinden began teaching in the Mayfield School District, but both my sister, V. Jane (Hodges) Nau, Class of '48, and my brother Robert R. Hodges, Jr., Class of '50, have fond memories of her from their studies in biology and mathematics.

Very importantly, it should be noted that Miss Sinden also wrote the Mayfield High School Alma Mater.
