




















AFTER HOURS — Our Alternatives to the Soaps ...



P.S. McDonald's management . . . You're the reason we enjoyed doing it, and nobody can do it like you can.






HOMECOMING '80 — Setting Sail Together







BIDDY BASKETBALL — The Foundation of our Dynasty





Not the Pinata





There are no varsity letters given here ... just satisfaction from serving and helping others.




Someone who is a non-reader will probably never read the material printed on this page, much less pick up a copy of *VOICES*, our school literary magazine.

MODEL U.N. — Let it Begin with U.S.












It happens every spring. No, not baseball . . the Model U.N. Anyone who has not participated in this annual rite of spring probably never read past the first sentence.

UNderstanding.






DREAMING OF COLUMBUS


GYMNASTICS — No BARS to Future Success


Had we been able to witness the many and varied segments of Mr. Johnson's career over the last twenty-plus years, we might better appreciate his total involvement in our school system.











